LEAVE A LEGACY

May 16, 2018 was a historic day. Five community leaders met to officially create the Marimor Legacy Foundation, a new nonprofit corporation for the express purpose of providing financial support for individuals who are served by the Board. The founding board members are Esther Baldridge, Angie Herzog, Greg Miller, Mary Jane Mullenhour, and Curtis Shepherd. The Marimor Legacy Foundation is registered by the State of Ohio and is a 501(c)3 nonprofit under the IRS.

Our community has been very supportive of the work and services of the Board for over fifty years. While so much is being done to support individuals with disabilities, more can be accomplished with additional resources. When our community is presented with a need, the response is always very positive.

For a number of years, the Board has raised funds to meet unusual and urgent needs that cannot be covered with tax dollars, such as rent deposits, clothing for a new job, or health and safety needs. These funds will be handled by the Foundation. Additionally, the Foundation will manage the funds involved in our annual Chicken BBQ fundraiser and other donations made to the Board.



This past year, the Board started to raise money for an all-inclusive public play-ground located at Marimor School. This playground will be linked to the Ottawa Metro Park. While just over \$30,000 has already been raised, much more will be needed before this project becomes a reality. You have an opportunity to be a part of this great project by making a donation or helping to build the playground when that day arrives.

SPECIAL FRIENDS: A MINISTRY OF LIMA COMMUNITY CHURCH

Serving children in the community has always been one of the primary goals of the Lima Community Church of the Nazarene. It was apparent to Pam Little, Director of Children's Ministries, that serving children with disabilities was a need in their congregation. The Children's Ministry created Special Friends, a program designed to support families of children with special needs so that the entire family has the opportunity to fully engage in church.

The Ministry provides a family restroom complete with a changing table, a sensory room for kids birth to twelve years old who have difficulties in the Children's programs, and Buddies who are matched with kids in the program. These Buddies are specially trained to understand and work with the kids who need special loving care, allowing parents to attend their own service while knowing their child has the support he or she needs.

During the past year, we joined a statewide initiative to bring County Boards of DD together with our local providers to creatively and collaboratively address quality issues such as staff shortages in our service delivery system. Jana McVetta, Director of Quality & Support Services, and I were part of the Allen County team, as well as Ryan Knodel of Benchmark Human Services and David Bloom, Janet Seward and Jennifer Fisher of IHS Services. Together we met with the larger statewide group and then back here in Allen County we met with our local Provider Group on this project. We are grateful to have received grant money from DODD to help with some of the cost of these goals.


We embraced the attitude that the concerns our Providers face with staffing are also our concerns, as they impact those we support every day.

Here are some of our local outcomes:

- We provided startup funds for DSPOhio.org with many other County Boards of DD across the state to hopefully encourage more workers to apply for the jobs available in our field.

Although our time on this pilot project ended in August 2018, we know that our work is not finished. Stay tuned for more ideas to help with the staff shortage. If you or someone you know is looking for work, our providers have a job for you!

FREE COMMUNITY SCREENING

If you are concerned about your child's development, or are just interested in free screenings for your child, put October 2nd on your calendar.

All children birth to age 5 are invited to our FREE Community Developmental Screenings which include:

Hearing, Vision, Speech, Nutrition, Behavior, Autism, Growth, Dental & Motor Skills.

Waivers are one way to pay for services that help people with developmental disabilities. We administer three different types of waivers: The Individual Options (IO), Level One, and Self-Empowered Life Funding (SELF). Each of these waivers has different spending limits and offers some different services.

By braiding together multiple funding sources, such as local county board of developmental disabilities funds and Ohio Medicaid benefits, a person with developmental disabilities may be able to have their service needs met without a Medicaid waiver.

The county board will work with you to help you find and coordinate services to meet your needs, using all available resources.

Nearly 96,000 Ohioans access services by working with their county board of developmental disabilities, direct service providers, and provider agencies to get the support they need to live the life they want. We serve nearly 900 people yearly in Allen County.
