### Who can get vaccinated?

*Please check back here often for updates about upcoming clinics and ways to schedule. The information can change quickly.*

### We are currently in Phase 2D: Ohioans 16+

*Vaccine recipients must be age 16+ to be eligible for the Pfizer vaccine (with parental or legal guardian consent), and age 18+ to be eligible for the Moderna and Johnson & Johnson/Janssen vaccines.*



### We are now using the **Get The Shot** online scheduling tool for COVID-19 vaccine appointments.

Starting March 31, we will begin holding mass vaccination clinics every week from Wednesday—Saturday to provide the single dose Johnson & Johnson/Janssen vaccine. Appointments are open to anyone 18+.

### Need a ride to a vaccine appointment?



Allen County RTA is offering FREE rides to people to vaccination clinics through April 30, 2021. *(Limit of 2 round trips per person.)*

You must tell the driver that you are going to an approved vaccination site to be able to ride for free.
